



Refreshment and Food:






Conclusion:




Feedback Analysis


The received feedback were analysed as follows.




Based on the responses from the students, 60.5% students found the educational field trip to Jain Irrigation System Ltd. to be very relevant and 36.8% students found it somewhat relevant to their curriculum or academic goals. This response indicates that the educational tour was aligned well with the students' curriculum objectives.




The response data suggests that the educational tour was highly effective, with the vast majority of students (84.2%) reporting a significant improvement in their understanding of morphological understanding of plants. However, responses from 15.8% students indicating a more limited impact, suggesting room for further improvement to ensure a consistently high level of effectiveness for all participants.



The response data suggests that the educational tour was very relevant, with the majority of students (81.6%) reporting a significant relevant in their project work of preparation of e-album of drugs used in Unani System of Medicine. However, responses from 18.4% students indicating somewhat relevant, suggesting room for further improvement to ensure a consistently high level of relevancy for all participants.




The response data suggests that the educational tour provided the opportunities to score high to a significant number of students (60.5%). However, responses from 28.9% students indicating that tour provided somewhat opportunities to score high in their periodical assessment paper.



Based on the response provided, majority of the students (84.2%) learned Morphological identification of medicinal plants, exposed to various advanced agriculture practices, exposed to the various agriculture products for the fruits, vegetables and medicinal plants. However 10.5% students responded that they exposed only to the various advanced agriculture practices.




Nearly all students (94.7%) indicated that they felt adequately mentored by their teachers during the tour. This positive outcome suggests that the mentoring experience was effective and well-received by the students.





Only 52.6% students rated the comfort of the journey to and from Jain Irrigation System Ltd. as "Very comfortable", while 44.7% rated it as "Comfortable". However a significant number of students rated the comfort of journey very uncomfortable. Overall, the data suggests need of improvement in comfort of the journey.

8. How would you rate the quality of food provided during the trip ³⁸ responses




The majority of students (52.6%) rated the food quality as "Good," indicating a positive perception of the food provided during the trip. A significant number of students rated it as "Excellent" (23.7%), and as "Average."





Majority of the students (55.3%) reported that the field trip provided ample opportunities for bonding with their classmates. This positive outcome suggests that the tour was successful in fostering connections among the students.





Most of the students (86.8%) expressed a willingness to participate in future educational tour to other locations. This response indicates a high interest level among the participants for engaging in similar activities in the future, showcasing a highly positive reception and enthusiasm for educational tour.
